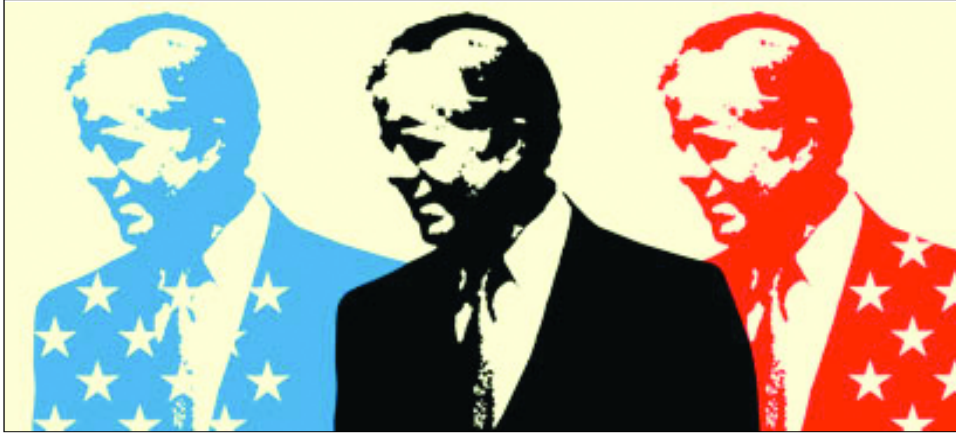
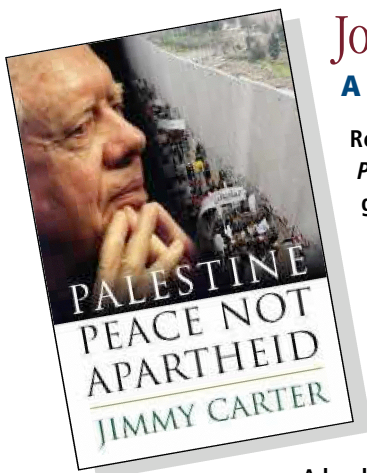


Jimmy Carter: Man From Plains
